Family Child Care Selection Checklist

Finding quality childcare can be a challenge. The following checklist, although not inclusive, is provided to help guide you in selecting a Family Child Care Provider that meets your child's needs. If you should need assistance, have questions or concerns, or would like to become a provider yourself, please do not hesitate to call the Family Child Care Office at 707-424-4596 / 707-424-8104.

- ♥ Interview several providers start the interview process in advance of need.
- ◆ Ask for references whenever possible, contact current and past parents. Don't be afraid to ask questions about the care provided in the home!
- ▼ Find out if the home is licensed all licensed homes display the Family Child Care logo in their front window and have a license signed by the Mission Support Group Commander posted on their parent board.
- ★ Ask about the availability of back up care in the event the provider is unable to provide care for your child.
- ♥ Spend as much time as possible with the provider to see if his/her attitudes regarding child-rearing practices are compatible with your own.
- ▶ Let the provider interact with your child not all providers and children are well-matched. You should try to select a provider with whom your child feels at ease with. Does the provider respond and talk to children in a positive, warm and understanding way?
- Ask very specific questions about the provider's discipline techniques Family Child Care providers are prohibited from using corporal punishment even with parental permission.
- ✔ Clarify your needs and expectations be sure you and the provider understand all that is expected from the child care arrangement. Do the program philosophies and values coincide with your own?
- Review the provider contract prior to signing. Ask about the provider's rates. If you would like to participate in the AF Subsidy Program, does the provider accept subsidy?
- ◆ Ask about flexibility of provider's hours. Can the provider accommodate the hours you need?
- ▶ Look for evidence of good hygiene and sanitary conditions all licensed homes are inspected monthly. Ask to review the provider's last home inspection or drop by the Family Child Care office for information.
- ▼ Review the daily schedule and activity plans do the activities planned for the children offer a balance of inside/outside and child/teacher initiated activities?
- ▼ If the provider you have interviewed seems to be wrong for you or your child find someone else.
